Sir:-

Replying to yours of August 29th asking information about Levi St. Cyr, Calls Horse Looking and Mark Penoi, I have to respectfully advise you that Levi St. Cyr came to Carlisle from the Winnebago Agency, Nebraska, August 5th 1887, when 19 years of age. He graduated in 1891, and has since been acting as foreman of our printing office. I am about to nominate him for the position of Assistant Printer, to fill the place of Mr. Claudy, who has just resigned.

Calls Horse Looking, Sioux, is also a product of this School. He came November 14th 1883, when 15 years of age, but had no previous schooling. He is in our Eighth grade, but away from the School under our Outing System.

Mark Penoi, Pueblo, came to Carlisle October 4th 1885, when 15 years old, without previous schooling. He graduated in our class of 1896.

Both Calls Horse Looking and Mark Penoi are fairly well instructed as harnessmaker and blacksmith, which positions they ask. They are good farm hands.

Neither of them are at the School and I am unable to tell you how far they would go from their present homes, but think they would be willing to go to any place appointed, provided they had means to pay their traveling expenses.
