Sir:-

Replying to your letter of September 19th, marked "Education, 35755-1896," directing that I advise your office when and how B. F. Green was admitted to this School, and furnish full list of all the members of the Five Civilized Tribes whom I have in this School, together with dates of admission, I have to respectfully advise you that B. F. Green was admitted with a party of eleven October 11th 1893. Our records show that he is a Shawnee and he disclaims that he is either a Choctaw, Chickasaw, Cherokee, Creek or Seminole.

I have also to respectfully inform you that so far as I know no members of this School belong to any of the Five So-  
Called Civilized Tribes.
