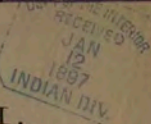

ACTION:

Any disbursing or other officer of the United States, or other person who shall knowingly present, or cause to be presented, any voucher, account, or claim to any officer of the United States for approval or payment for the purpose of securing a credit in any account with the United States, relating to any matter pertaining to the Indian Service, which shall contain any material misrepresentation of fact in regard to the amount due or paid, the name of the officer of the article furnished or received, or of the service rendered, or to the date of purchase, delivery, or performance of service, or in any other particular, shall not be entitled to payment or credit for any part of said voucher, account, or claim, and if any such credit shall be given or received, or payment made, the United States may recover the amount so paid, or the person receiving the credit or payment, and recover the amount from either or both, in the same manner to the full extent of the United States are collected; PROVIDED, That where an account contains more than one number for other debts shall apply only to such vouchers as contain the misrepresentation; AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That the officers and persons by and between whom the business is transacted shall be presumed to know the facts in addition to the matters set forth in the voucher, account, or claim; AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That the foregoing shall be in addition to the penalties now prescribed by law, and in no way to affect proceedings under existing law for like offenses. That, where it shall be shown that this section shall be printed on the blank forms of vouchers provided for general use. (Act March 1, 1883, § 8, 22 Stat., 421; Act July 4, 1884, § 8; Cir. 113 Ind. O.)
