Sir:-

In connection with the request for transfer made by Dr. Z.T. Daniel which I forward herewith, I would respectfully advise you that a year ago, after I had requested Dr. Daniel's transfer from Pine Ridge to Carlisle, I had an application for the place from Dr. Edmund Barry, then Agency Physician at Ft. Hall, Idaho. Dr. Daniel's long delay in reporting led me to make some inquiries in regard to Dr. Barry at his home in Washington. The information received convinced me that he would have been my choice for School Physician among the physicians then in service within my knowledge, had I not already requested Dr. Daniel's transfer. Dr. Daniel has been many years on the Plains, and feels himself better calculated for duty there than here. My preference would be to hunt for my own physician, and secure one whose habits and spirit are in keeping with the work at Carlisle. As this cannot be, I will say that if Dr. Barry is available for Carlisle, and you think favorably of the transfer between the two, I believe it would be mutually satisfactory.

Should you have a vacancy for Dr. Daniel, and be willing to allow me for a time to get on with an attending physician from the town, I would be glad to do that for the reason that I can get such service for \$50. or \$60 a month and thus make a needed saving to my appropriation. An early change here would be a favor.
