
Sir:

Replying to your letter of March 8th, marked "Education, 7569", I have to respectfully advise you that four laundresses are authorized at this school. These places are now filled as follows:

Carrie Thomas, regularly appointed; Annette Suisson, nominated February 24th, approved by your Office March 12th; Lizzie James and Jennie Wolf, approved temporarily. I have no Indians as competent as Lizzie James and Jennie Wolf. If not imperative that Civil Service should hunt elsewhere for persons to fill these places and Lizzie James and Jennie Wolf can be permitted to attempt to show to the Civil Service Commission that they have the necessary literary qualifications, they would be glad to do that.

Miss Laura Wetzel, seamstress, whose place is not yet filled, would also undertake to demonstrate that she has the literary ability if the opportunity can be granted her.
