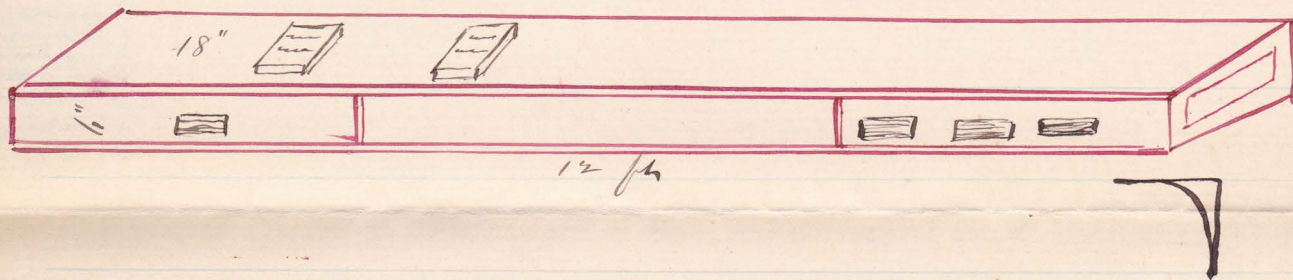

screws. This to be supported on stout Brackets of  
good reading height - against partition wall,  
the space below to be covered with matting.
