Sir:

Referring to the matter of a physician for this school, I have to respectfully report that I can secure from the town the daily services, to the fullest extent necessary, of any physician for the sum of \$500.00 per year, under an agreement that he will visit and take care of the sick at least once daily, and, if necessary, in cases of emergency, oftener. This I now believe will be the best arrangement for us. Several of the best physicians of the town have spoken to me about it, and we may easily have our pick. I recommend that I be allowed to enter into an arrangement for this service at the price named, for the remainder of this fiscal year.
