

Replying to your letter of April 14th marked "13402" advising that William Sherrill applies for work in connection with the Indian Service, and desiring statement as to the character of work he is competent to do, I have to respectfully advise you that William Sherrill is good for little more than an ordinary laborer. He is inclined to be discontented and to shift places often. He has worked in our Tin Shop and can make common articles of tin-ware tolerably well. He was out on a farm every summer while a student here and has given fair satisfaction. If he received \$15.00 to \$18.00 a month and his board, or its equivalent, it would be a good salary for him.
