Sir: In compliance with orders received, I submit the following in connection with my request for leave of absence:—  
I entered the Indian Service in 1893, serving one year at Siletz, Ore., and three years at Carlisle. Have attended summer schools as follows:

- 1894. Indian Institute at Salem, Ore.
- 1895. Summer School of Methods, Bedford City, Va. taking course in Methods, Drawing, Geography, & History. 4 wks.
- 1896. Cook Co. Normal, Englewood, Ill., — taking Nature Study, Lectures on Kindergarten work, Geography, & Primary Methods. 3 wks.

This year I wish to attend the Cook Co. Normal, beginning July 5th, lasting three weeks. Will take course in Nature Study, Drawing, History & Literature, and Primary Methods.

Before entering the Indian Service I taught five years in the public schools of the State of Illinois, attending the local summer schools from one to four weeks during the summer, and other educational meetings.
