The Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C.

Sir:

I have the honor to submit herewith a statement of irregular service needed at this school during the current month, viz:

An assistant is needed in our tailor shop owing to the great amount of work to be done there in making and repairing clothing for our male pupils.

The position of Asst. Disciplinarian at \$600. per year is vacant, and I have a graduate of the class of 1897 whose services I can secure, temporarily, at \$1.00 per day.

The services of an Asst. Nurse (which position is authorized at \$360. per year) are indispensable. These duties have been very satisfactorily performed for several months by Ella Rickert and Joseph Adams jointly, at a saving of more than one-third of the salary authorized.

The services of an assistant in the large boys! quarters are needed to take the place of Clarence W. Thunders Asst. Disciplinarian, resigned.

The large boys! library and reading room require the careful attention of one of our boys as librarian.
