
Dear Sir:

Wm. F. Campbell, former pupil and graduate of this school, and also a graduate of the Minnesota Law School at Minneapolis, informs me that he has been hired by his tribe, the Chippewas, to look after their legal affairs, and that his contract is before you for approval, and desires me to speak a word to you in his behalf.

William particularly attracted my attention while a student here because of his logical and strong mind, and after he left Carlisle I personally aided him considerably to enable him to get through the law school at Minneapolis. He has had many difficulties to contend with, and I am especially pleased to know of this confidence reposed in him by his people, and trust there may be no Office delay in giving him the opportunity this appointment offers.

Judge Browning told me one time that a legal paper drawn up and presented by Mr. Campbell to the Department on behalf of some tribal interest, indicated exceptional legal qualities.
