The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,  
Washington, D.C.

Sir:

I respectfully request that Supt. Pierce of the Oneida Boarding and Day schools, Oneida, Wis., be instructed to favor the coming to Carlisle of 10 or 12 of the most suitable agency school boys and girls, either from his Boarding school or from the Day schools, between the ages of 14 and 18 years, of good health and character and having the consent of parents, the party to consist of half boys and half girls. There are 10 or 12 of our students who went home this summer that should return and Miss Isabella Cornelius, <sup>former</sup> pupil and graduate of Carlisle now teacher in the public schools of Conn. is acting as my agent to bring these back and any others who may offer and are suitable.

We should have from 10 to 12 from the Oneidas every year and there will be no difficulty if the authorities there do not oppose.
