Replying to letter of August 21st, marked "Superintendent 34236 - 1897," signed "W. N. Hailman, Supt. Indian Schools," I have to respectfully advise that Julia M. Williams, of Leaton, Mich., a graduate of this School, class of 1897, throughout her normal course and for three months in teaching thereafter in charge of one of our sections showed that she had some good qualities for one of her years and limited training for the position of teacher. Were it not that she has been almost continuously at Carlisle and has had no training and education beyond our course, I should be glad to have her return here as assistant teacher. It would be better, however, for her and for the service if she is given an appointment, that she work elsewhere. She would do fairly well for the place of assistant matron in a small school.
