

It has been a long time since I have written a letter to you. I have often thought of writing but my sister hears from you some times and I always hear through her and I am sure you must have many such letters and if I wrote you would feel as if you ought to answer my letter so I have not written. I have not been very well this summer and for the last two months have been under the care of the Agency physician Dr. Stephenson. He says if I could leave home keeping for a while it would do me more good than medicine. There is to be a vacancy soon in the Field Matrons place and he urges me to apply for it.
