Sir:

Replying to your letter of the 11th, marked "Education, 5745-1898", enclosing letter from Mrs. Caroline Warren in regard to her children, I have to respectfully advise you that the number of pupils we have now, and those whom I have arranged for, is so great as to make it quite impracticable for us to accept of any more at the cost of our own funds for transportation this school year.

These children are so white as to have absolutely no trace of Indian blood, and are, therefore, objectionable. It is especially desirable here, where we are standing for the whole school scheme and the whole race, that we should, so far as possible, be supplied with students who are really Indian.

Mrs. Warren's letter is herewith returned.
