

Sir:

I am in receipt of a letter dated the 2nd inst., signed by the Superintendent of Indian Schools, marked "Supt. 1961, 1962," asking my estimate of the character of Mrs. Laura Pedrick nee Doanmoe, nee Toneadlema, for the position of field matron, and also statement relative to Delos Lonewolf who has applied for the position of disciplinarian. While at this school between the years 1879 and 1882, and 1884 to 1888, Laura was an exceptional young woman and made excellent progress. She married Etahdleuh Doanmoe, one of the very best young men we ever had at the school, and with him returned to her home, where after a year or more he suddenly died. After this she fell into bad habits. She afterwards married the soldier Pedrick, and I understand is more exemplary in her conduct. Her father was Red Otter, one of the greatest men of his tribe, and Laura, herself, has unusual influence among her people. She is said to be the best interpreter the Kiowas have.

Delos Lonewolf while at Carlisle was one of the best and most efficient young men we had; was our Asst. Disciplinarian for about 8 months. If inspired by the same principles as when here, he would make a good disciplinarian.
