Replying to your letter of April 7th marked "M" in regard to Carlisle Exhibit for Omaha, I have to respectfully advise you that as yet nothing has been done, the understanding was that the Nashville Exhibit was to go to Omaha pretty much as it was.

A new lot of school work cards are ready. The cards in relation to the Outing System, etc., and some cards illustrating the School, should be in condition suitable for use again, as they were in good condition when packed.

In packing at Nashville all articles that went from Washington were returned there, and all that were sent from Carlisle were returned here and are still in store.

The two Kensington cases are very nearly completed, and can be ready for use at any time. No information has been received here in regard to what was desired in regard to this Exhibit, therefore nothing has been done specially in the way of preparation; but we intend shortly to get at the material, look it over and put in good condition for use again.


The information in regard to graduates is nearly complete, but there are a few yet to be heard from. I have no photographs suitable for use in connection with this information.
