
Sir:

Mr. Wm. Gray, the Dairyman in charge of the school herd, is a member of the N.G. of Pennsylvania, and as such has had to join his company for duty.

Mr. Gray desires to retain his position; and in accord with the order of the Honorable Secretary of the Interior, as published in the newspapers, I desire to fill the place temporarily by using the salary of Mr. Gray to pay three Indian boys, who have had experience, and who I think are capable of attending to all dairy matters for a time at any rate; these to be paid on my roll of irregular employes from month to month.

I, therefore, request your authority to meet the needs of this position as above stated for the balance of this fiscal year, giving one boy \$12, one \$10 and the other \$8 per month, which cover the \$30 paid to Mr. Gray, and while it lasts does away with the \$5 per month, each, heretofore asked for milkers.
