To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C.

Sir :-

Referring to the remarks on Pages 3 & 4 in your letter dated the 20th inst. marked "Finance - 30379," etc., I have to respect fully enclose herein corrected " estimate of supplies", etc. with more explicit statements in regard to each of the several articles named therein, covering an expenditure of \$422.41, which I trust may be found satisfactory. Most of the articles as you will see were on my annual estimate and are required now in order that I may be able to get the place in shape for the fall opening of school.

In regard to the \$500.00 to purchase supplies needed which have been asked for on the annual estimate and not delivered, I have to say that almost throughout the whole eighteen years of this school's history, I have had such authority each year in order to meet the necessities of the school caused by delays in shipping supplies. We ask for our supplies in January. The lettings are made before the first of July and the delivery of supplies lingers so that December and often January only sees them all here. Several times after waiting months for delivery at much inconvenience, we have found that articles asked for had been omitted in the letting. I anticipated much less trouble this year than formerly and so haveasked only \$500.00.00. Heretofore I have had \$500.00 authority, and sometimes found it necessary to ask

a duplicate of that.

Referring to that part of the Honorable Secretary's comments which states, "In fact, it appears that some of the articles he (Capt. Pratt) desires authority to purchase now, are intended for a whole year's supplies", I have to respectfully advise you that in so far as these particular cases are concerned, I was endeavoring to conform to your circular of September 30th, one paragraph of which says; - "A requisition for authority to make purchases in the open market should, regardless of aggregate cost, cover all the actual requirements of the service for the current year as far as it may be practicable for intelligent business foresight to anticipate them." Also, to conform to your letter of May 31st marked "Finance 11426 - 98", the closing paragraph of which reads as follows:-

"For articles therein mentioned which you state can be ontained more economically in the open market, you are instructed to submit proper detailed estimates from time to time, as you may deem necessary."
