

Sir:

I have been bothered for two or three years by a hotel- and saloon-keeper at Ringoes, in New Jersey, selling intoxicants to my boys in the country, and have been unable until now to get what seemed good enough evidence to bring a case against him. I wish now to do that, but as some time ago, under the former administration, I attempted to bring a case, and found the District Attorney lacking in disposition or energy to co-operate, I would respectfully request that the Attorney-General be requested to direct the District Attorney at Philadelphia to prosecute the case or cases I may bring, under the act approved January 30, 1897.
