

Sir:

Chauncey Yellowrobe, assistant disciplinarian, left this morning for his new station at Ft. Lewis, his official connection with us to be ended on the 31st inst. I respectfully request to be at once supplied with an assistant disciplinarian to fill his place. The salary is \$600. After a full canvass of the subject it seems best that we have a white man. He should be single, 25 years or over, and strong, morally, mentally, and physically, and not afraid of work. Inasmuch as the assistant disciplinarian is often in full charge of matters pertaining to this department, he should have a knowledge of military drill and gymnastics.

I have said above, "at once." I trust there may be no delay. We shall have from 350 to 375 boys to handle within three weeks.
