
By the salary allowances for this school the current fiscal year, I have an assistant printer at \$240 and a band manager at \$250. The latter position is being filled by James Wheelock, and the former position was filled by Leander Gansworth who left the school July 30th to accept a position in a printing office in Boonville, N.Y. My manager of the printing office desires to make use of James Wheelock in the printing office as assistant printer. James is a graduate of the school and is naturally dissatisfied with his salary. He was offered the position of band master at Carson, Nevada at, I think, \$720 per year. He is an exceptional musician. On conference with all the parties interested, I find that he can perform his band work out of working hours largely, so as not to take more than an hour a day from his work of the printing office, and that he is the best qualified for the position of assistant printer. In order to keep him in the band and give us the best results we can obtain just now, and as long as the two positions are filled by him, I would like the positions consolidated

and have, therefore, to request that the salary of assistant printer and band manager may be paid to the same person, so long as the position is filled by Mr. James Wheelock, making in all a salary of \$490.00
