The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir:

Replying to your letter of Sept. 9th marked "Education, 40, 825", I have to respectfully advise you that the salaries paid to the Assistant in the Outing Department and the Assistant in my office of \$10 a month each have been on the irregular roll for the last two months, and it escaped my mind that they were not on the regular roll.

I, therefore, for the reasons before stated request to have the salary of the Librarian increased to \$25 per month, and to have two additional clerical assistants, and be allowed to pay \$25 per month to each.

For special reasons I now ask that the salaries be all \$25 per month, instead of one at \$30 and two at \$25. All three of the parties are graduates of the school.

I dislike to make request for change of salaries, and additions between times, but the work to be done compels it. We shall have about 900 children under care by the end of September, and almost 300 of them will be in the country under our Outing.
