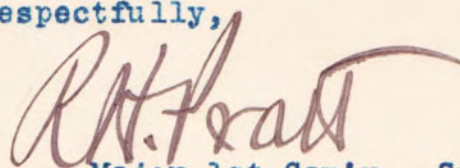

Harnessmaker:

Sir:

Complying with verbal instructions of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, you will take the first train and proceed to Chicago and report to Mr. Spooner, Supt., of the warehouse at 1602 State Street, to inspect the harness leather proposed to be delivered to this school under our estimate for supplies for the current year. Our estimate calls for 3000 pounds of harness leather, oak, 15 to 22 pounds to the side. This is what we want, what we have asked for, and what we expect to get.

Ticket to Chicago and return is furnished you herewith. Keep a careful memorandum of all your expenses, and take sub voucher receipts on blanks herewith for all amounts you expend of \$1.00 and over; for sums less than \$1.00 you need not take receipts, but put expenditure down at the time on your memorandum book.
