To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir :-

In accordance with my recommendation last year for additional buildings at this school, approved by appropriation of Congress therefor, I have to respectfully advise you that after a careful consideration of all the needs I conclude it will be best to make an addition to the east end of the present school building, of two school rooms, one below and one above, of exactly the same dimensions as those now in use, being 31 ft. I enclose blue print plan of the original building which shows the conformations intended as to foundations, thickness of walls, windows, doors, etc. ; also an addition to the west end of the building, extending 45 ft., containing two stories and basement. The last will provide a large basement room for the Sloyd department. On the next floor a room divided into six small recitation rooms for use of the Normal department, using what is now No. 6 school-room for the main room of the Normal department. A hall will open from the same as per enclosed plan, and the divisions be as shown. This also gives on the upper floor a large room for the Senior class which is to be divided into two rooms, giving a suitable room for such apparatus and experiments as have been found necessary for the proper instruction of both the Junior and Senior classes, and leave a room amply large for the recitation room of the Seniors. The foundation walls at the eastern end of the building will be 20 .

inches as now, but on account of the additional weight, I would make the foundation walls at the western end 2 ft. in thickness. As the ground permits of it, I would also add a lower porch from which to enter the Sloyd room.

It is most urgent and desirable in order that these improvements be completed and ready for use in September, that we begin construction at once. I desire as far as possible to do this work with my own mechanics and their apprentices, because of economy and the instructive value, hiring only such additional help as may be necessary such as stone-masons, bricklayers and plasterers, and added help for the carpenter.

I therefore respectfully request authority to purchase on open market bids the necessary material and labor, to be paid for when the appropriation therefor becomes available, after the first of July, the following :-

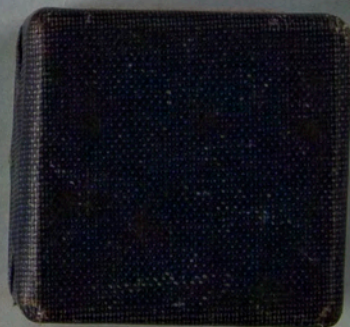

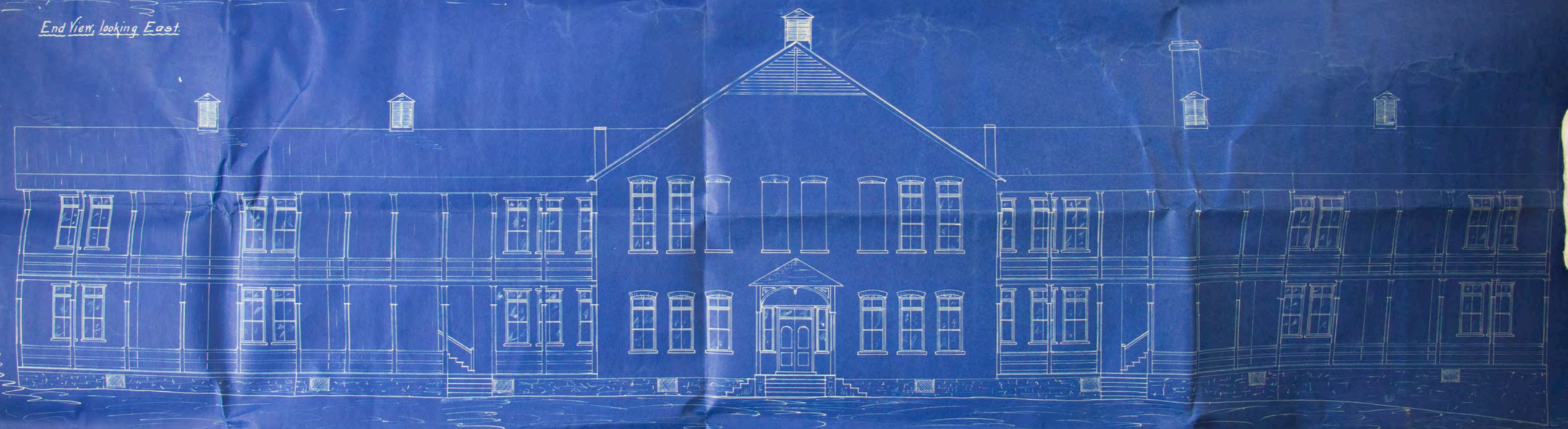


End View, looking East.

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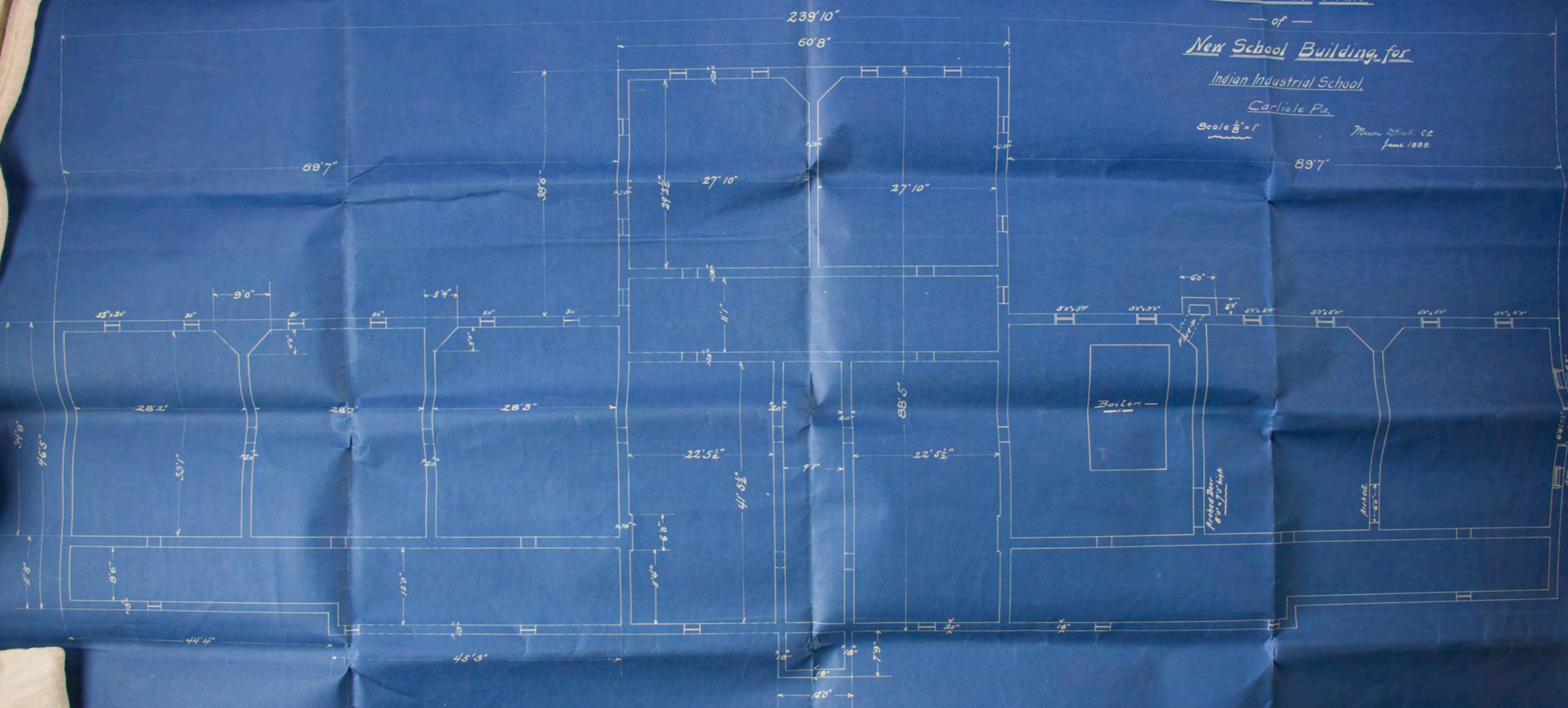


Front View
