To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir :-

One of my pupils, Thomas Walker, an Omaha, at a country home near Lime Ridge, Pa. was taken sick with smallpox early in April. So far as we can learn it was communicated to him by letter from home, a sister having died there with what was called "malignant measles". Soon after receiving the letter announcing her death, Thomas was taken sick. I sent my school physician there with one of our boys who had had the smallpox, instructing him to have Thomas quarantined at some point near his country home, place the boy in charge and make arrangements for medical attendance, etc. A shack was put up on the farm remote from the house and the patient was isolated and quarantined strictly under the care of Dr. I. R. Wolfe, of Espy, Pa.

I now have Dr. Wolfe's bill for attendance, amounting to \$37.50, and respectfully ask authority to pay the same.
