Sir :-

Replying to your letter of the 28th inst. marked "Education 28163" in regard to the letter of Mr. Frank Baker asking for the return home of his children, Hattie and Alice Baker, stating that their three years will be up in August, etc., I respectfully state that Mr. Baker is in error as to term, which for all pupils who enter Carlisle is five years unless they graduate sooner.

In regard to the health of the girls, the showing by the cards in regard to Alice is correct, but both girls are now having their summer outing, as per reports herewith. The family with whom Alice is living are excellent people, and in a previous case where student's eyes needed attention they had them looked after and bore the expense. We feel therefore that she is in good hands in this particular.

There is no trouble in regard to the health of the other girl Hattie. I believe the girls are well located and that there is no need of any such action being taken at this time as is asked for, but with this statement of the facts I await your further instructions in the matter.
