Sir:

Replying to your letter of the 16th instant marked "Education 38670-99" with enclosure from Supt. Peairs in regard to the transfer of Miss Wood to Haskell, I respectfully refer you to my letter of June 22nd in regard to this matter (copy herewith) with the statement that no change that I am aware of in Miss Wood's intention and wish has since occurred, and she therefore remains at Carlisle, providing the increase of salary asked for in my letter be granted.

By office letter marked "Education 32074-99" I was informed that the request of Mr. Peairs for the transfer would not be granted for the present without more satisfactory explanation. I therefore regarded the incident as closed, except for the change in Miss Wood's salary, which I asked for the fiscal year.

Your letter says "it may be possible if you will submit after school commences the establishment of a \$720 place for Miss Wood it will be recommended;" but gives no assurance that such will be the

case. I therefore regard the settlement of Miss Wood at Carlisle as contingent only on the increase in salary, which I again urge to be granted, to date from July 1st.

Sir:-

Since sending in my salary list, Miss Wood, one of our teachers at \$660, has received an offer from Supt. Peairs of the Haskell School to go there as Asst. Prin. Teacher at a salary of \$800. Miss Wood's home is in western New York only a few hours ride from Carlisle. Her mother is in very precarious health, and she would prefer to remain at Carlisle at \$720 than to go to Haskell for \$800. The two salaries of \$720 which I asked on my Annual Estimate were for two teachers of special worth in their departments. I dislike very much to ask for a change in my salary list at this early date, particularly to increase it, but it seemd best in the interests of the School to do so.

I therefore request that I be allowed one additional salary of \$720, and one less salary of \$660 for the fiscal year 1900.
