

I have the honor to recommend that authority be granted for the Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian Industrial School, Pennsylvania, to expend a sum not exceeding \$344.55, or so much thereof as may be necessary, (subject to Section 80 of the Regulations of 1894) in the open market purchase, at lowest obtainable rates, not to exceed, however, the rates and quantities herein specified, of the following materials, delivered at the School:
