Dear Sir.

On September 26th. 1899. our Supt. Mr. Hugg wrote you asking you if Wesly Thomas, Lloyd Nephew, Lawrence Jimerson and Chauncy Adams could not be transfered to Carlisle as they were very restless here. I have had some of these boys out at my country place so I could be able to see myself what kind of boys they were. After talking with them and watching them carefully I can find no fault with them. They have been told by outside parties that they must report every thing that goes on at the Home and are not bound to obey rules, that they cannot be corrected or punished for any offence and that is the reason that they have been restless and dissobedient, wanting to go out when they pleased with out permission etc. I have I think made them understand how wrong it is to listen to outside persons and be so independent and they have promised to give no more trouble. We have secured places for four of our boys during this fall, one plumber three painters. Chauncy Adams has been two weeks with me and I find him very deaf. He says he has been so for five years the result of scarlet feaver. I do not think he will give any more trouble. So we will withdraw our application to have them transfered to Carlisle.
