It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any REPEATED message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the sending of the same, unless specially insured, nor in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the running of its lines, or for errors in cipher or insecure messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to its original destination.

The Company can be INSURED by contract in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment of premium thereon, at the following rates, in amount to the usual charge for repeated messages, viz. one per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two per cent. for any greater distance.

Responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until the same are presented and accepted at one of their transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of this Company's messengers, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

Messages will be delivered free within the postal limits of the terminal office. For delivery at a greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or structure penalties in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with this Company for transmission.

This is an UNREPEATED Message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be returned against only by repeating a message back to the sending station for comparison.
