
To the Honorable,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter dated May 10th., marked "Education 22397 - 1900," enclosing resignation of Jas. D. Flannery, assistant tailor at this school, to take effect May 5th., I have to respectfully advise you that Mr. Flannery left here surreptitiously, and without the knowledge of any of the school authorities, on May 5th. I have since learned that he told one of the Indian boys he was going to join Welsh Brothers' Circus.

I have heard nothing of Mr. Flannery's whereabouts since his departure, and as he will probably never return here I respectfully request that I be authorized to submit his relief to date from the date to which he was last paid. April 30th, 1900, His letter is herewith returned.
