It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, or for non-delivered message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any REPEATED message beyond fifty times the sum received for the same, unless specially insured, nor in any case for delay arising from unavoidable interruption in working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or obscure messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent in cases where, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

Receipts in the transmission of messages, at any point on the lines of the Company can be INSURED by in writing, stating agreed amount of loss, and payment of premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the usual charge for repeated messages, viz: One per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two percent. for any greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until the same are preceded and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if messages are sent by such office by one of its Company's messengers, he is held for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

Messages will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery at a greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any cases where the claim is not presented within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.
