

Sir :-

Last year Byron Wilde, a pupil of this school from Fort Berthold Agency, was desired at home for some special purpose, and the Indian Agent wrote assuring me that if I would allow him to go home he would see that as soon as the business was attended to, Byron would return to Carlisle. Byron did not return to Carlisle, nor was sufficient reason given.

I am recently in receipt of a letter from Hampton Institute advising that Byron Wilde was endeavoring to enter there and asked in regard to him. These conditions were made known to Hampton and it appears they have notified him that they are unwilling to receive him unless he is dismissed from Carlisle. Byron writes, asking that dismissal. I have written him that I will not favor his going to any other school and that as he is now 23 years of age he could not enter any school without special permission from the Office, and that I have asked that such permission be not granted him for entrance to any other government school.
