It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the form hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, if any REPEATED message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any REPEATED message beyond fifty cents the sum received for sending the same, unless specially insured, nor in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or obscure messages. **Contract** Conditions hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

Correctness in the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be insured by contract in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment of premium hereof at the following rates, in addition to the usual charge of repeated messages, viz: one per cent for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two per cent for any greater distance.

Responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until the same are presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices and if a message is sent to a locality by one of this Company's passengers he is not liable for its non-delivery. It is the duty of the sender to see that the message is properly addressed for its destination.

Messages will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery at a greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any case where the conditions not provided in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.

This is an REPEATED message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be corrected only by repeating a message back to the sending station for comparison.
