
Sir :-

Mr. E. H. Brock resigned his position as assistant disciplinarian at this school and left the 31st of August. The place is therefore vacant. Mr. Brock did not take the examination, as he had made up his mind to quit the Indian service and study law.

I have been made to believe that Mr. W. Lewis Haldy, a graduate of Dickinson College, who took the examination in Harrisburg, is a worthy young man. He has been to see me twice and explained that he wished to enter the Indian work and remain in it, working his way up. He is very highly endorsed by Hon. W. W. Griest, Sec. of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by Dr. George Edward Reed, Pres. of Dickinson College, and also by Mr. Brosius, M.C. from Pennsylvania, who is chairman of the Civil Service committee of the House.

With these statements I leave the matter in your hands and request that we may have an assignment as early as practicable, as the work is very heavy now and on the return of the boys from the country about the 15th of September, it will be very greatly increased.
