Sir :-

Miss Lida C. Sabin, of Lebanon, Ohio, who was appointed assistant matron at this school June 25th at a salary of \$480 per annum, and instructed to report immediately, reported for duty July 2nd. As this was by virtue of the civil service laws and the same was probationary until the end of that school year, and she did not report until July 2nd, there was no chance to give her a probationary test within the time named. A very few days after her arrival, Miss Sabin demonstrated extreme fault-finding and back-biting qualities. I admonished her and let her have ample time to correct these traits or confirm them. I am now compelled to report that she is entirely unsatisfactory, and I have so informed her. Her resignation is herewith, taking effect last night. I request that an assistant in place of Miss Sabin be furnished at once.

Mrs. DeLoss, one of the assistant matrons, is absent on her annual leave and is too ill to return when her leave expires, Sept. 15th and take up her duties. She is entitled to all leave considerations, both sick and annual, because of her faithfulness. Her case must conclude itself. Physically, I fear, she is not equal to the work of the position she holds here. She will probably ask

for sick leave, which I will approve. It is therefore not likely that we can count on her services before the 15th of October.

Miss Sabin's going leaves Mrs. Dorsett in charge alone, and as the return from country outing is filling up the quarters and children are coming in from the west, the work is excessive. The emergency is great. I need two helpers until Mrs. DeLoss's case is determined, and ^{the} a new assistant in place of Miss Sabin reports. I therefore request authority to hire two at the rate of \$520 per annum each, beginning Sept. 3rd; service of one to end when Mrs. DeLoss returns, and the other to end when an assistant matron in place of Miss Sabin reports for duty .
