
Sir :-

Referring to our telephone conversation this morning covering Mrs. DeLoss's case, I think best to write you.

Mrs. DeLoss is a most excellent person, a lady of refinement, and somewhat musical. Her home is in Washington where her mother and son, both dependent upon her, have been living. As it is necessary for them to quit their home there, she had planned to have them come to Carlisle and take rooms; but my school physician says she ought not to remain in this climate this winter on account of incipient lung trouble which requires great care of health and a milder, drier climate. It was necessary for her to make up her mind at once, on account of her son and mother; hence my calling you up by phone.

Mrs. DeLoss is loath to leave Carlisle, but feels that the obligations upon her call for extra care of herself in order that she may not fail entirely. I trust she may be favored in the matter at once if practicable, and that some suitable person as assistant matron be sent me in her place. Is there not someone who would be willing to exchange places with her ?
