

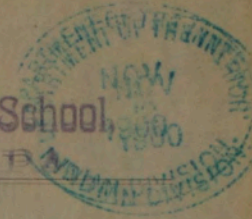


I have the honor to transmit an estimate of supplies, etc., required for the service at the agency under my charge, as above, amounting to \$ 494 $\frac{15}{100}$, and respectfully ask for the necessary authority to purchase the same¹ *In open market*

I also ask authority to publish an advertisement inviting proposals in the case in the²

and to make contract with the lowest responsible bidder, or bidders, for the delivery of the articles estimated for.
