
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir :-

Replying to your letter of the 7th inst. marked "Education 53045 - 1900" enclosing letter from Louisa John inquiring about her son, George Jameson, I have to respectfully advise you that I have just called George to my office, and he tells me that he lately wrote his mother addressing her, "Louisa Jameson"; that a previous letter to her under this name, since his arrival at Carlisle, brought him a letter from her, but that he did not write to her while at Lincoln Institution. Hereafter, his letters will be addressed to Mrs. Louisa John. We require monthly letters to parents, which are written in school and under the teacher's supervision, so that we may know there is no slip. It happens sometimes, as in this case, that pupils' do not have correct addresses of parents or guardians, but letters are written and reports enclosed, and mailed regularly. In addition to this students are at liberty to write as often as they care to.

Mrs. John's letter is returned herewith, and I have notified her that her son is here, is well, and getting on nicely.
