
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

An annuity payment of \$100,000 was made to the Indians of this reservation in September, 1900, and you are hereby advised of the roll numbers of the following Indian children of this reservation, now pupils in attendance at your school, in order that they may make application to the Hon. Commissioner of Indian Affairs for their individual shares of the said payment. The per capita is \$71.68 and the following should present their claims to the Indian Office at once:

Clarence Rainey	-	Roll No. 729,
Edith Bartlett	-	" " 797, <i>Wants it here.</i>
Hiram Faulkner	-	" " 802, " " "
Jeanette Pocatello	"	" " 1120, <i>Wants it here.</i>
Rebecca Broncho	"	" " 1146, <i>country.</i>

17 Clarence Faulkner drew his share before leaving here, and the shares of Ella Ashbaugh and Annie Parker were drawn by their parents, they being under age. If you will inform the children of their roll numbers and see that their claims are properly made out and sent in, I will appreciate it.
