



POSTAL TELEGRAPH-CABLE COMPANY. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it REPEATED; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, one half the regular rate is charged in addition. It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that the sender shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any telegraphed message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any telegraphed message beyond the sum received for sending the same, unless specially insured, nor in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruptions in the working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or obscure messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other company whose representative is held in strict action.

For transmitting the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be done only on a flat rate charge for repeated messages, viz: one per cent for any distance not exceeding 200 miles, and two per cent for any greater distance.

It is the responsibility regarding messages attached to this Company until the same are presented, accepted at the office of the transmitting office; and if a message is sent such office by one of this Company's messengers, he is responsible for their mishaps as the agent of the sender.

Messages will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery to other offices within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.

This is an UNREPEATED Message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be corrected against only by repeating a message back to the sending station for comparison.
