This Company transmits and delivers the within message subject to the following

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it REPEATED; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this one half the regular rate is charged in addition. It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face of and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that the Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, or for non-receipt of messages, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, or for non-receipt of any message beyond fifty times the sum received for sending the same, unless specially insured, but in any case for days arising from unavoidable interruption in the service of the lines, or for errors in cipher or absent messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

Errors in the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be insured by contract in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment of premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the special charge for repeated messages, viz: one per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two per cent. for any greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages attachable to the Company until the same are presented and accepted at the office transmitting offices; and that messages sent in such place none of this Company's messengers, he acts as the agent of the sender.

Messages will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery over a greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the Company for transmission.

This is an ~~extraneous~~ message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be claimed against only by presenting a message back to the sending station for comparison. No employee of this Company is authorized to vary the foregoing.
