POSTAL TELEGRAPH-CABLE COMPANY.

This Company transmits and delivers the within message subject to the following TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it REPEATED; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, one half the regular rate is charged in addition. It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of a message repeated message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any REPEATED message beyond fifty times the sum received for sending the same, unless specially agreed, or in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the transmission of its lines, or for errors or omissions observed by the sender, or for any other cause which the Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

On the line of the Company can be insured by the sender, in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the usual charge for repeated messages, viz: one per cent for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two per cent for any greater distance.

Responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until the same are presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is not received at such office, one of this Company's messengers, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

Messages will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery elsewhere, a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

Company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.

This REPEATED Message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be corrected against only by repeating a message back to the originating station for comparison.
