Sir:-

Complying with request in your letter of the 26th inst., marked "M" in regard to the statistics of the industrial department, I respectfully state that during the (12) months ending March 31st., 1901, the Industrial departments of the school have made the following articles besides doing all current repairs required in the several departments of work, viz:-

✓ The Sewing Room has made 1408 dresses, 2642 shirts, 2468 prs. of drawers besides other articles, bringing the total up to 12,962 pieces.

✓ The Tailor Shop has turned out a total of 688 coats, and 1240 prs. of pantaloons, all cut in the shop but a portion made by outside help.

✓ The Shoe Shop has made 974 prs. of boys' shoes and 530 prs. of girls' shoes.

✓ The Tin Shop 1380 articles of tinware besides work on roofs, spouting etc.

✓ The Harness Shop has made 113 sets of double harness, and 1 set of single harness; quite a number of them were fine driving sets, the balance hand-made work harness.


The Blacksmith and Carriage Shop has made (30) vehicles: spring wagons, buggies and surries, - besides doing horse-shoeing and

farm repairs.

✓ The Printing Office publishes a sixteen column weekly folio, "The Red Man and Helper" with a circulation of about 6,000; does all the job work for the school, such as circulars, programs, posters, pamphlets, school lessons, lists, admission tickets, etc. etc., working from twenty-five to thirty apprentices half days each.

The Laundry work averages 9,500 pieces weekly.
