

Sir :-

Replying to yours of May 8th marked "M" in reference to cutting down one of the large exposition cases, I send you side and end view with dimensions, as made by my carpenter, who suggests that he can cut the case in two either way. Halving one way it will make two cases a little over 8 ft. long and a little more than 2 ft. wide; halving it the other way, a little over 4 ft. square. The glass cost about \$50 per case and is of the very best, so that in whatever is done it would be well to preserve the sizes of glass.

We can do the work at any time we have your instructions.

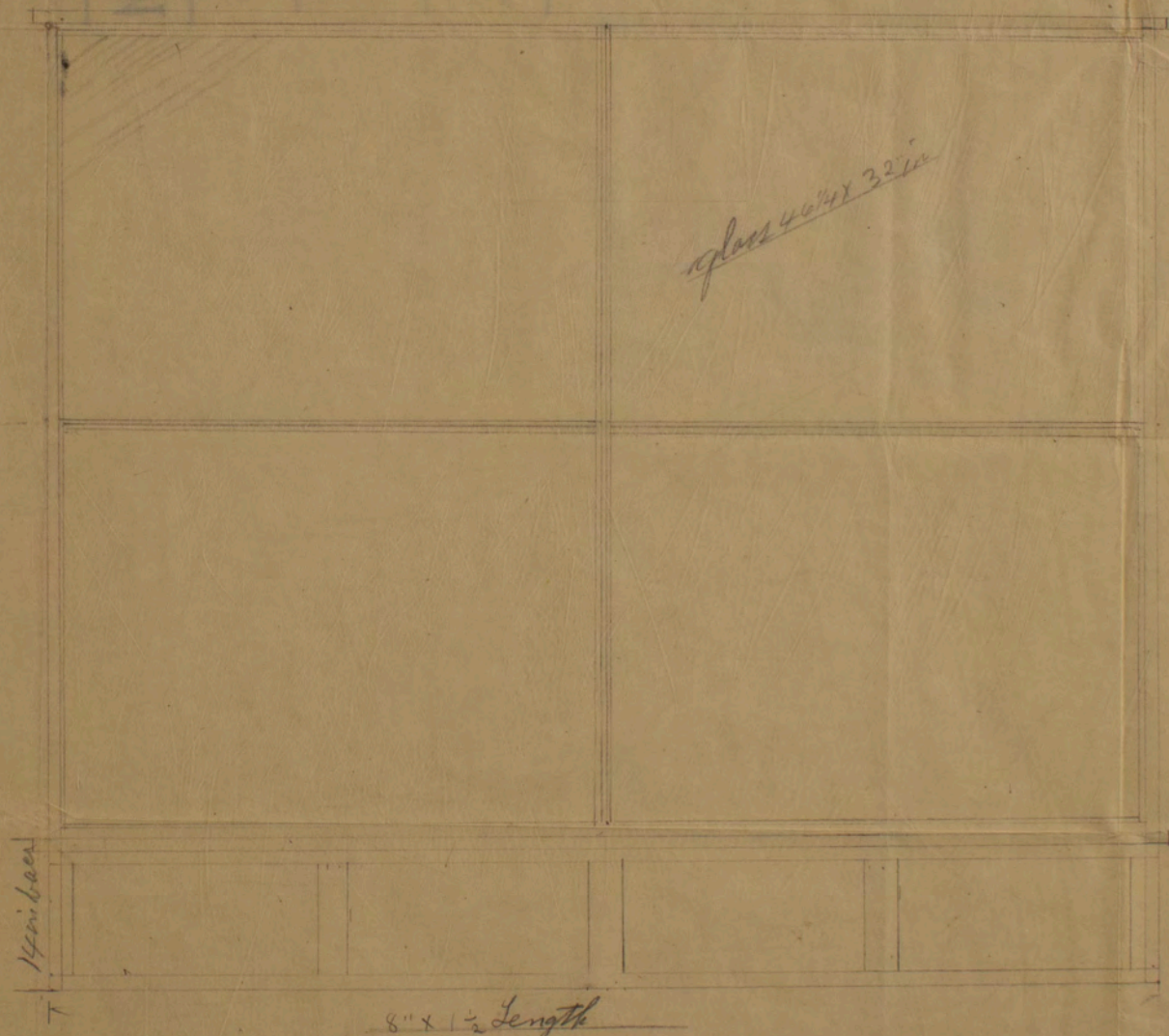
