
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir :-

I have to respectfully inform you that Mr. Haldy, the assistant disciplinarian, has recently not been satisfactory in his position. On Sunday morning last I instructed him to get some information for me, and as he had not given it to me by evening I sent for him and asked him about it. In the interview his manner and words were not proper and I told him that that would do. He turned to go away, and as he went off he muttered something. I called him back and stated that under the circumstances I felt it best to say that he would not be needed after the end of the month. He spoke again in an unfortunate manner and I had to dismiss him to stop his talk. He walked off a little way and came back and informed me he would leave immediately. I told him "Very well" and he went away, but came back again and demanded to know how much leave he was entitled to. I told him that under the circumstances he was only entitled to leave to the end of the month. It was arranged accordingly both to his satisfaction and mine, and I respectfully request that my action in granting him leave from Sunday evening to the expiration of the month be approved, and that his quitting the service be also approved.
