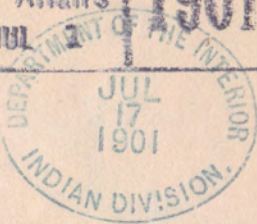


To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir:-

In the lettings here was 18 dozen sheepskins and they were awarded to George H. Evans at \$6.25 per dozen. They are decidedly a superior article and exceptionally large and satisfactory. It was the only thing that Mr. Evans got. He complains that the expense of making out a bond, putting on the government stamps, and getting the bondsmen, costs him more than the profits on the sheepskins, and begs me to retain his check until he furnishes the skins. I therefore respectfully request your authority to buy in open market 18 dozen sheepskins at not to exceed \$6.25 per dozen, and obviate the difficulty.
