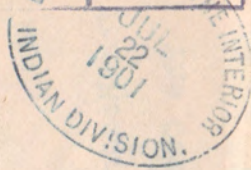


To The Honorable,
