

Sir :-

On Feb. 21st by letter I submitted to you a list of property for which I am responsible, needing the action of a board of survey or an inspector. I thought I understood the new regulation and my letter did not conflict with that. On March 7th by letter marked "Accounts, 10725 - 1901" my attention was invited to Sec. 379 of the Regulations of the Indian Office, 1894, as amended under date of June 1st, 1900, and to circular letter of May 29th, 1900, transmitting same, but no further information or action was vouchsafed.

On April 4th I wrote again about the matter and on April 9th had a reply which still left me without a way out because an inspecting officer seldom visits Carlisle. I seem to be helpless in this case, and hope the Office will see that and help me out. If it can be arranged so that I may get the property reported and the added six months' accumulations since my first application off my hands immediately after the end of July, it will be a relief. I write this now hoping there may be time to arrange it. However well the new regulation operates elsewhere, it is plainly an annoying hindrance at Carlisle.
